VOGLER: The public hearing on the Draft 4 Environmental Impact Report for Plan Bay Area 2050 is now 5 open and is being transcribed. 6 7 Staff just presented on the Draft EIR and shared highlights of the environmental analysis and 8 9 findings. All of these documents were posted on Friday, 10 11 June 4th, 2021 at Plan Bay Area.org and are available for public inspection for the public comment period which 12 13 will close at 5:00 PM on Tuesday, July 20th, 2021. If you wish to testify, please press the raise 14 hand button or star 9 on your phone's keypad and once I 15 16 call on you, please unmute yourself by pressing the microphone button in Zoom or star 6 on your phone's 17 18 keypad. We ask that each speaker be brief and concise 19 and keep their comments to no more than three minutes. 20 When making your comment please state your name 21 22 for the record organization if applicable, and be sure to 23 speak clearly into your computer or phone's microphone so 24 that Mark can capture your comment accurately. 25 If Mark cannot hear or understand you, he may

Page 4 interrupt you and ask you to slow down or speak up. 1 2 Please remember that we will not be responding 3 to comments during the hearing. So let's begin. So again, if you could press 4 the raise hand button on your computer and then unmute 5 yourself. So I'll wait. We're going to wait a minute 6 7 here to see if we have any comments. I'll give it thirty more seconds. 8 9 Again, if you wish to testify, use the raise hand button bottom of your screen or press star 9 to be 10 11 put in the queue. Okay. Susan, please unmute yourself. 12 13 PUBLIC SPEAKER: So since there aren't other questions coming forward, I -- I --14 15 MS. VOGLER: Susan, I'm so sorry. You're 16 muted. 17 PUBLIC SPEAKER: There, okay. I --18 MS. VOGLER: Repeat your comment again. I'm 19 sorry. 20 PUBLIC SPEAKER: Okay. So my name is Susan I with Catalysts for Local Control and I've been 21 Kirsch. 22 following Plan Bay Area for a long time. 23 And while this isn't specifically about the 24 Draft EIR, I guess my -- and since you're not responding 25 to questions, anyway, I'll make in this a comment to say

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repeatedly going back to 2013, there's been great concern 1 2 about the process by which you at ABAG/MTC come to 3 conclusions like you are again this year both with the content of Plan Bay Area, which I know is not the subject 4 of the hearing right now. You're talking about the Draft 5 EIR, but that it's very lacking in transparency and it 6 7 seems to be very lacking in a true interest in calling in the public to understand both what you're doing and the 8 9 good work that you're intending. But the confusion about -- about what you're 10

11 doing by the fact that your presentation is filled with 12 the jargon for people who aren't up to speed with all of 13 the acronyms of transit rich areas and priority 14 development areas and whatever the other language is.

Yet you have no time that you're providing real interaction that might feel like there is genuine commitment to the well-being of the Bay Area that would give a voice to regular people who are trying to do their part to participate, to local community leaders and to elected officials.

And this is kind of like being in the tsunami of you guys having apparently so much money and so much time that you're able to repeatedly go into all of these details for a plan that goes out to 2050 without a commitment for bringing people along with you.

Page 6 So I will just register that as the comment. 1 2 MS. VOGLER: Thank you, Susan. 3 Are there any other comments on the Draft Environmental Impact Report for Plan Bay Area 2050? 4 Please use the raise hand button now. 5 6 Gerald. Please unmute yourself. 7 PUBLIC SPEAKER: Okay. Sorry. David mentioned something a little while ago that I wanted to 8 9 comment on in some way. He talked about transit oriented development 10 11 and he talked about -- he also mentioned that many trips are not commute trips, and most of the analysis that goes 12 into selecting the value of transit oriented housing 13 would face a commute. 14 The question if you put it close to buses or 15 especially rail, you'll get some additional riders. 16 Is there any data to back up what kind of 17 18 actual inclusion you will get with all of this clustering around transit entities? 19 20 Because my personal feeling is that without a lot more than just a bus line or two or maybe a BART 21 22 line, most people, all of us would continue to do a lot of our travel, which is at least seventy-five percent of 23 24 all travel is non-commute, by car, and that's -- that's 25 the question or comment.

Page 7 Thank you, Gerald. MS. VOGLER: 1 2 Do we have any other comments on the Draft EIR? 3 Again -- oh, Susan. PUBLIC SPEAKER: Okay. I know that much of 4 the work on Plan Bay Area is done initially with the idea 5 of reducing greenhouse gases. 6 7 So I want to bring forward an article that I just read in the last day or two. This is under the 8 9 heading under Environmental -- Environment as a subject saying that carbon dioxide levels hit fifty percent 10 11 higher than pre-industrial times, and that we have -maybe what we're seeing is that with all the of the 12 planning, with everything that's going on is that we 13 really are not moving the needle for re -- reducing 14 greenhouse gas emissions and that we're actually with 15 many of the kinds of projects that are going forward 16 increasing and contributing to climate change as we have 17 18 a focus on economic growth that is really unsustainable in light of the way in which economic growth so often 19 20 contributes to increasing greenhouse gases. Thank you, Susan. 21 MS. VOGLER: 22 Do we have any other comments on the Draft EIR? 23 And I could be mispronouncing it. Is it Ferank? Please 24 unmute yourself. 25 PUBLIC SPEAKER: So I've been away for a while
